**I. Welcome and Introductions.**

Council Member Jeff Longwell, City of Wichita, opened the meeting; members, staff, and guests introduced themselves.

**II. Review of Minutes from the October 22, 2010 REAP Legislative Committee Meeting**

Ms. Stephanie Knebel, City of Derby, moved (Council Member Longwell) to approve the minutes. The motion passed unanimously.

**III. REAP Legislative Committee Business**

1. Kansas Affordable Airfares Update

Mr. Joe Yager, Chief Executive Officer for REAP, provided an update on the Kansas Affordable Airfares Program audit. Staff met with the audit team earlier in the month and provided them with information about REAP and the history of the KAAP. The auditors noted that they will be following up on the information submitted by REAP and the CEDBR study. The auditors plan to finish their review before the start of the 2011 legislative session.

2. T-Works Consultation Meeting Review

Council Member Jeff Longwell, City of Wichita, reported that he recently attended the T-Works local consult meeting and noted that there were many jurisdictions in attendance including REAP member communities. Council Member Longwell stated the improvements to 235 and Kellogg and the improvements to east Kellogg were at the top of everyone's list. Council Member Longwell concluded his report by noting that infrastructure improvements are important to the region and its economic development endeavors.

3. ULA Report

Mr. Yager reported that the ULA has been passed with the inclusion of the KAAP.

4. Communications Policy Request

Mr. Les Depperschmidt, Regional Director of AT&T Kansas, presented a letter of legislative support regarding modifications to state communication law. Mr. Depperschmidt then answered questions from committee members and noted that a draft of the letter is located on page 5 of the agenda packet. Council Member Longwell thanked Mr. Depperschmidt for including REAP in his outreach efforts and requested that Mr. Depperschmidt provide the committee with a draft of the bill that will be put before the legislature when it becomes available. The Committee agreed that this issue was worth evaluating in the future when legislation was available to determine an appropriate response.

5. 2010 REAP Policy Summit

Mr. Yager provided an update on the 2010 REAP Policy Summit. Mr. Yager reviewed the draft agenda and noted that invitations will be go out later today via e-mail. This year the keynote luncheon will be co-sponsored with the Wichita Independent Business Association. Mr. Yager encouraged committee members to invite members of their councils and commissions as well as staff to the event.

6. 2010 Work Plan Updates and Review

Council Member Longwell requested that the committee review the 2010 work plan. Council Member Longwell encouraged committee members to send updates and recommendations for the 2011 work plan to staff prior to the next committee meeting.

7. Discussion of REAP Survey Results

Mr. Yager noted that results of the 2010 REAP survey are located on page 8 of the agenda packet. Mr. Yager encouraged committee members to contact staff if there are any questions regarding the survey results.

8. Strategic Planning Process Review & Identification of Work Plan for 2011

Ms. Bruckner led the committee through a strategic planning exercise utilizing themes developed by REAP members at the 2010 REAP retreat. Staff will utilize the feedback gathered to develop a draft legislative work plan for 2011 that will be forwarded via email so the committee will have the opportunity to make changes to the work plan prior to its approval at the next legislative committee meeting.

## **REAP Legislative Committee 2011 Legislative Priorities**

Adopted December 13, 2010

### ***Legislative Priorities***

- Maintain Kansas Affordable Airfares Program to assure more flight options, more competition for air travel, and affordable airfares for Kansas.
- Advance legislative and administrative action to secure state financial participation in:
  - the Equus Beds Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Project to preserve the aquifer for agricultural, industrial, and municipal use that is essential to the regional economy.
  - aviation research at the National Institute for Aviation Research at Wichita State University.
  - orthopedic research at the Center of Innovation for Bio Orthopedic Research (CIBOR) at Wichita State University.
- Support a reevaluation of current state water policy including Kansas Water Authority representation; revenue sources and distribution for the state water plan fund; and, the process for adopting the annual state water plan fund budget.
- Support a stronger system of business-driven technical training and education in Kansas including enhanced funding support, better alignment and articulation of education and training programs, and transition programs to better serve adult learners.
- Support federal reauthorization of the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 to include maintaining local control through private sector and employer driven Local Workforce Investment Boards.

## Draft of the REAP Legislative Committee (LC) 2011 Work Plan

**Mission:** *To guide state and national actions that affect economic development in the region, and to adopt joint actions among member governments that enhance the regional economy.*

- 1) **Provide a unified voice** to promote regional economic development.
  - a) Collaborate with private, non-profit, and public sector stakeholders on regional economic issues.
    - i) Expand the composition of the Legislative Committee to include representation from various industries and groups.
    - ii) Engage the business community through increased participation and communication.
  - b) Strengthen relationships with existing partners.
    - i) Evaluate REAP representation on WAMPO.
  - c) Encourage dialogue on regional economic development.
    - i) Evaluate process for determining legislative priorities to increase participation.
  - d) Instill regional identity through coordinated branding.
  
- 2) **Guide state and national policies** that impact regional economic development.
  - a) Engage local leadership to represent the region at the state and national level.
    - i) Identify and make REAP members aware of legislative issues of significance to South Central Kansas and promote engagement.
    - ii) Develop and implement ongoing communication procedures between REAP and area legislators.
    - iii) Coordinate local leadership, including public and private sectors, when appropriate and on an as needed basis to engage in the state legislative process on REAP supported issues.
    - iv) Coordinate with member jurisdictions to encourage promotion of issues with Congressional delegation.
    - v) Develop a local government's guide to lobbying.
  - b) Develop relationships with state and federal governmental officials.
    - i) Invite state and national legislators to attend REAP meetings and events.
    - ii) Invite officials from the local offices of the Governor and Congressional delegation to participate with the Committee.
  - c) Establish a process to identify policies affecting specific industries.
  - d) Coordinate a unified agenda for regional economic development.
  
- 3) **Engage stakeholders** on issues shaping our regional economy.
  - a) Provide regional forums that connect REAP membership with private, non-profit, and public sector stakeholders.
    - i) Conduct an annual regional legislative policy summit that includes relevant speakers and topics.
    - ii) Develop and host issue specific forums.
  - b) Conduct outreach on the purpose and accomplishments of REAP.
  - c) Involve REAP membership in educational opportunities.
  
- 4) **Support inter-jurisdictional planning** on issues affecting economic development.
  - a) Promote the benefits of a sustainable regional economy.

- i) Coordinate local activities when appropriate to engage citizens in the process of sustainability planning.
  - b) Determine REAP's role in regional planning.
    - i) Initiate activities to engage REAP in regional transportation planning.
  - c) Engage professional staff in multiple jurisdictions for sustainable planning.
- 5) **Lead the region** in addressing future economic needs.
- a) Create a vision for regional economic development through REAP.
    - i) Develop an ongoing branding/marketing strategy.
    - ii) Develop a communication plan with media contacts to disseminate information.
  - b) Determine the organizational capacity to support the future structure and needs of REAP.
    - i) Monitor progress on legislative priorities for 2011 and give guidance to legislative liaison as issues arise.
    - ii) Recommend legislative priorities to REAP for the 2012 legislative session.
  - c) Be proactive in identifying and discussing emerging issues.
    - i) Identify speakers to provide information on emerging issues.
    - ii) Monitor and report issues of regional concern from attending conferences, organization meetings, and visiting with member communities.
